Church Information Meeting and further developments

The presentation about Affiliation with the Association of Baptist Churches of NSW/ACT has been circulated and can be accessed here.

The presentation explains why the likelihood that we will be disaffiliated from the Association is high, and that a possible alternative for us may be the Open Baptist association.

A link to the initial formal gathering is now included on our website. A conference, Open Baptist-**Dreaming of New Begin**nings followed to gather ideas about what the various aspects of the Association might look like.

Baptist church leaders and members and pastors from New South Wales, Victoria and the ACT attended the conference. NSW&ACT churches and pastors who may not be

able to agree with the Mar- 1. We are not prepared to riage Position Statement attended and may join the new association because of the shift from baptistic values of autonomy of the local church and freedom of conscience. Find out more about the conference outcomes here.

During my presentation on 15 October, I included the comment that there was no biblical discussion of the Association's definition of marriage throughout 2 years of discussion. I commend to you, the most recent Paper from Canberra Baptist Church, for a fuller comment on this point.

I emphasized at the meeting that:

- divide our church or disenfranchise those who call **Tuggeranong Baptist** Church their spiritual home on the basis of their belief about this societal issue or their marital status or style.
- 2. We are not prepared to surrender our autonomy in order to ensure that our values are not inconsistent with those of the Association.
- 3. We are not prepared to alter our governance style to develop mandated position statements in addition to our statement of beliefs and Constitution (Rules of Incorporation).

Assembly Council have sent an Update on the Way Forward regarding Affiliation, Baptist Values and Same Sex Marriage and notes on the Ordinary Assembly of 11 November 2023.

They advised that,. to be able to keep the 4-month communication timeline set by Assembly, the next Annual Assembly has been moved to June 2024.

Finance

Budget—church and individual call to review

The Treasurer presented a balanced budget for 2024 that depends on an increase in our annual offerings of \$58,086.

Our budgeted monthly offering is \$20,375

Baptist churches are each responsible for meeting their own expenditure. There is no central funding body.

Charities and community organisations receive benefits through tax exemptions and targeted grants. Churches qualify

for these benefits in the same way as sporting organisations.

We are stewards of the resources God has given us and all need to continually and prayerfully consider our financial management and to make sure that we are giving what we have *determined in our heats to give* 2 Corinthians 9:7

In the last 12 months, we have seen increases in the cos of living, increases in salaries and wages and increases in in interest rates that affect both invested funds and mort-


gages and loans. All these need to be taken into account as we review our personal budgets.
